Double your Pleasure

Tulane sweeps Texas Arlington

Tulane swept a pair of games from the University of Texas at Arlington Mavericks at Turchin Stadium Sunday. Games like this are often called a "twin bill", and the games were very much like identical twins. Tulane's own Fab Four (hitters 3,4,5, and 6) accounted for all of the RBI's in both games. Also in each game, the starting pitcher went 5 innings, the 2nd pitcher went 1 inning.

Game 1 – Tulane 10, UTA 3



Tulane's Billy Mohl pitched 5 innings, and got the win, despite giving up a run each in the first 2 innings. Once he settled down, the Fab Four hitters - Hamilton, Swackhammer, Barket, and Bogusevic, were 7-15, with 5 doubles and 10 RBI's. Freshman Mark Hamilton, a High School All-American from Bellaire, Texas, had 2 doubles, 2 runs scored, and 5 RBI's. Swackhammer, Barket and Bogusevic each had a double in the first game. Hamilton's doubles in the 3rd and 4th inning are even more impressive, when you consider that they came with 2 outs in each of the innings.

Sophomore Matt Goebel pitched 3 innings in relief, giving up 1 earned run, and Freshman Chris Worster, from Florida, pitched the scoreless final inning.

Game 2 – Tulane 6, UTA 1



2003 Freshman All-American J.R. Crowel started the 2nd game of the double header, and went 5 innings, giving up 1 earned run. Just as in game 1, Hamilton, Swackhammer, Barket, and Bogusevic drove in all of Tulane's 6 runs. Hamilton hit another double, for his 3rd double of the day. Bogusevic hit the first Triple of the season, in the 3rd inning. The Fab Four went a combined 6-15 this game, and when you add in the 7-15 in the 1st game, gives them a total for the day of 13-30, or .433. Other impressive totals for the Fab Four are 6 doubles, 1 triple, 6 runs scored, and only 2 strikeouts in 30 at bats.

Freshman Daniel Latham, from Covington, Louisiana, had an impressive outing, going 3 innings, striking out 3, giving up only 1 hit, and no walks or runs. Senior Pre-season Collegiate Baseball All American Joey Charron pitched the final inning, giving up 1 hit, and striking out 1.
