The Three Amigos

The trio of Billy Mohl, J.R. Crowel, and Cory Hahn shutout the Utes this weekend, as the Green Wave swept Utah by the scores of 3-0, 7-0, and 9-0. Pitching was the key, as the entire staff held the Utes scoreless for 27 innings. Recaps will follow, but here is how the Three Amigos did in their starts:

Billy Mohl 6ip, 5h, 6k, 0w J.R. Crowel 8ip, 2h, 9k, 0w. Cory Hahn 6ip, 4h, 5k, 0w.

The Three Amigos are now a combined 8-0, and in 47 innings, have struck out 62 batters, and walked only 3, have given up only 4 earned runs, and have an overall ERA of less than 1.00.

Overall, the Tulane Pitching staff has an ERA of 1.58, and has held the opposing team to a .205 batting average. They have struck out 86 batters in 80 innings, and have yielded only 13 walks in 80 innings, or approximately 1 every 6 innings.

Cory Hahn, Matt Goebel, Tyler Kimmons, and Joey Charron kept the pitching train on the tracks, as the Green Wave shut out the Utah Utes 9-0 on Sunday afternoon. Hahn lead the way with 6 innings pitched (Hahn's ERA for the year, is a perfect 0.00, over 2 games and 11 innings), with Goebel, Kimmons, and Charron each pitching an inning in reliefIn all, the Wave's pitchers gave up 6 hits while striking out 11.

For the offense, Dini, Swackhammer, Bogusevic, and Holland hit home runs for the Wave. Overall, the Wave had 12 hits today, and 30 for the weekend, out scoring the Utes 19-0.



For the weekend, Greg Dini went 7-11, with a double and home run, and had 5 rbi's.

J.R. Crowel held Utah to 2 hits over 8 innings, while striking out 9. Joey Charron pitched the 9th to preserve the shutout. J.R. lowers his ERA to 0.95. He has 22 strikeouts in 19 innings, while giving up only 3 walks. He and Billy Mohl lead the team in wins, both with 3 wins and 0 losses.

The offense came around, and was lead by Greg Dini, Brian Bormaster, and Tommy Manzella. The trio accounted for 8 of the 12 hits, and drove in 5 of the 7 runs. Greg Dini was 3-4, with 2 rbi's, Tommy was 3-5 with 1rbi, and Brian Bormaster went 2-4, with 2 rbi's, and hit a double and Home run.

Billy Mohl and Daniel Latham combined for a 5 hit shutout, as Tulane defeated Utah, 3-0. Mohl picks up his 3rd save, and lowers his ERA to 1.06. Latham picks up his first Collegiate save, and lowers his ERA to 1.12. Both pitchers have put up some outstanding numbers, as Mohl has 18 K's in 17 innings, and has yet to yield a walk. Latham has 8 K's in 8 innings, and has given up only 1 walk.

Offensively, the bats seemed to take the night off, as all 3 runs scored by Tulane were unearned runs. The Wave was 6-27 on the night. Small ball was the order of the day as Wes Swackhammer manufactured one run by getting hit by a pitch, and then stealing 2nd and 3rd, and then being driven in when Mark Hamilton hit a sharp ground ball to 1st, and got on by an error. Hamilton later scored after stealing 2nd, advancing to 3rd on a sacrifice fly by Bogusevic, and Barket getting a single. Dini drove in the other run, in which Bormaster scored.
