Bats go dry in the desert, Wave goes 2-2 on the week. (Note – not many pictures, as I did not travel to Arizona)

Tulane 1 – Arizona St. 5 (3/15/04-Sun)

On Sunday the Wave bats dried up, as Tulane got 6 hits in 33 at-bats, which equates to an astonishing .181 batting average for the day. For the weekend, Tulane was 23-104, for a .221 batting average. The Wave did have their chances Sunday, as they left 10 runners stranded on the base paths, for the 2nd consecutive game.

Cory Hahn pitched 6.2 innings, and gave up 4 runs. Joey Charron made his 11th appearance of the season, and pitched the final 1.1 innings, giving up 1 unearned run.

Joe Holland was the only multiple hit batter, although Brian Bormaster did get 2 walks, going 3-4 in the on-base department.

Tulane 3 – Arizona St. 11 (3/15/04-Sat)

The dry air played havoc with the gloves, and the bats were able to drive in only 3 runs. The batters stranded 10 runners on Saturday afternoon. Of Tulane's 8 hits, Barket and Bormaster had 2 each. The Sun Devils got 7 runs, 5 earned, on J.R. Crowel in 5 innings. Tyler Kimmons and Joey Charron pitched the final 3 innings, giving up the final 4 runs.

Tulane 5 – Arizona St. 3 (3/14/04-Fri)

Tulane led off the weekend with another solid performance by Billy Mohl. While struggling somewhat with his control (6 walks), he was able to get out of several jams. Freshman Daniel Latham pitched the final 3 innings, and picked up his 2nd Save on the season.

The bats were just potent enough, as Barket, Swackhammer, and Bormaster each drove in a run. Brian Bogusevic drove in 2 other runs, and had a triple on the evening.

Tulane 5 – UNO 0 (3/9/04 – Tue)

Tulane's Brian Bogusevic pitched 7 strong innings, and Freshman Daniel Latham pitched the final 2, as Tulane shutout UNO on Tuesday evening. The Popeye's cup is now even, 1-1, and will be settled at Zephyr Field on April 13th.
